SMART goals: Goals that are **S**trategic and **S**pecific, **M**easurable, **A**ttainable, **R**esults-oriented, and **T**ime-bound (O'Neill & Conzemius, 2005)

TIPS for Establishing Smart Goals:

Ensure your team's goal is aligned with the broader, overarching school-wide goal(s).

Clarify the level of achievement students were able to attain in the previous year.

Set a SMART goal that challenges your team to improve upon last year's performance.
